

District 4 Information

Kathy Hinkfuss is running to be the next State Representative to the Wisconsin State Assembly for the 4th district, which represents western portions of the city of Green Bay as well as Ashwaubenon, Allouez and Howard. (area shaded purple) Dave Steffen is the current Representative.

The district is suburban for which voters here have followed national trends and generally voted for Democratic candidates for national offices after 2016. In 2018 Democratic U.S. Senator Tammy Baldwin won the district with 52%. During that same election, Wisconsin's 4th Assembly District averaged a 48% voter preference for the Democratic candidates up and down the ballot. It is expected to shift again toward Democratic candidates on the ballot in 2020 with higher voter turnout and an increasingly unpopular incumbent Republican President.

Biography


I am a deeply-rooted, Brown County native, raised in West De Pere. My husband Tim and I are the proud parents of our three children that we raised in western Green Bay. My background and accomplishments, as a nurse, as an executive at a Fortune 200 healthcare company, and as the CEO of a local non-profit, make me the best person to bring fair and accurate representation to our district. My life experiences have led me to my purposeful decision to run for the Wisconsin State Assembly.

My father is a retired Journeyman Electrician and my mother was a homemaker. My civic and community engagement began early in life as an active 4-H member, competing every year at the Brown County Fair in gardening, sewing, and art. Through my community and family, I learned the value of hard work.

I studied practical nursing at NWTC and completed five years of clinical work, which led me to join a growing insurance company, Employers Group, later acquired by Humana. While working there full-time, I earned a bachelor's degree in business management from Silver Lake College. Wearing many hats and developing wide-ranging skills, I ultimately became Humana Vice President of National Service Operations. As a VP, I was responsible for the work lives of 5,000 employees and a \$170 million budget. Fulfilling a desire to directly serve my community, I

became the CEO of the YWCA Greater Green Bay in 2011. During my rewarding time with the organization I completed a \$3.3 million Capital Campaign and opened the Women's Empowerment Center, offering Family GED Classes and work-force training. In 2014, I earned my master's degree in business administration from UW-Oshkosh. Currently, I am a commissioner for the City of Green Bay on the Redevelopment Committee. I most recently graduated from Emerge Wisconsin, an organization that trains Democratic women running for local, state, and federal offices.
